## THE RABBI’S MESSAGE

- על שלשה דברים העולם עומד, על התורה, ועל העבודה, ועל גמילות חסדים -  
“The world is based on three principles: Torah, Divine Worship, and Kindness” (*Pirkei Avot* 1:2). These three pillars of the world are applied in the observance of Purim.

The following *Mitzvot* are associated with Purim:

### I. TORAH

The reading of the Megilah twice, the night of Purim and on Purim day. The Megilah was composed by the *Anshei Knesset Hagedolah*, the Men of the Great Assembly. The Megilah was included in the Holy Writings in response to Esther’s & Mordechai’s petition. The Gemara relates that Esther requested: כתבוני לדורות - “Inscribe me into the Holy Writings.”

Although the name of G-d is not mentioned directly, we see G-d’s divine providence present throughout the Megilah. Like the Torah, the Megilah is written by a scribe on parchment with special ink and is treated as a Holy Scroll.

Interestingly, the Tractate Megilah contains not only the laws of the Megilah, but also the laws of the Torah, and includes a schedule of the Torah readings for all holidays and special occasions throughout the year.

### II. AVODAH

The reciting of “Al Hanissim” in the Amidah, the silent devotional, and in the *Birchat Hamazon*, the Grace After Meals. It is included in the blessing of “*Modim*” in which we give thanks to the Almighty.

The *Seudah* – partaking of a festive meal on Purim day. Purim and Chanukah are two of a series of holidays established by our sages, just prior to and during the period of the Second Temple, commemorating Hashem’s rescuing His beloved nation from impending danger. These holidays are contained in the book entitled “*Megilat Taanit*” which lists the dates and a description of the events of these holidays. When the Second Temple was destroyed, the Jewish nation began an extended period of national mourning. As a result, our sages canceled the celebration of these rabbinic-

cal holidays with the exception of Purim and Chanukah, which were representative of all the other holidays. Chanukah represents the salvation of the Jewish nation from spiritual attack, while Purim represents Hashem's salvation from physical annihilation.

The Chafetz Chaim suggests that the reason that only Purim requires a festive meal is due to the fact that Purim represents the physical salvation of the Jewish nation. Chanukah, on the other hand, which commemorates the spiritual salvation, only contains spiritual acts - להודות ולהלל - To give thanks - *Al Hanisim*, to praise - the recitation of Hallel, and to light the Menorah.

### III. GEMILUT CHASADIM

Mishloach Manot – the sending of two types of ready to eat food items to at least one person. In the Book of Esther Haman describes the Jewish people as “scattered and dispersed” – our sages suggest that the lack of unity and harmony among the Jewish nation brought about the threat of annihilation through Haman’s diabolical plot. In order to merit Hashem’s grace, Esther, prior to her petitioning King Achashverosh, asks Mordechai to go “gather together the Jewish people.” With their unity and togetherness of purpose, Hashem would answer their petition. Thus, the act of *Mishloach Manot* is there to strengthen the bond of unity of the Jewish people.

Matanot L'evyonim – to give charity to at least two poor people. The Rambam, at the conclusion of the laws of Purim (*Mishne Torah* Chapter II:17), writes: “It is better for an individual to contribute more for *Matanot L'evyonim* than

make a more elaborate seudah or send *Mishloach Manot* to many friends and relatives, for there is no greater joy than to gladden the hearts of the poor and underprivileged. He who gladdens the hearts of the unfortunate, acts divinely.”  
The days and spirit of Purim shall never be nullified.

You can fulfill your obligation for *Matanot L'evyonim* by contributing to the Od Yosef Chai fund. These funds will be distributed in Israel on Purim day. Please see the Rabbi for details.

### The Four Special Torah Portions

During the month of Adar, we read four special Torah portions. The following is the schedule of the special *Parshiot* for this year.

- 1) Saturday, March 12th, *Parshat Pikudei*, **Shabbat Shekalim** (Exodus 30:11-16). In Temple days, during the month of Adar, they made a campaign to collect a half silver shekel from every male 20 years and older. (Shekalim I:1).
- 2) Saturday, March 19th, *Parshat Vayikra*, **Shabbat Zachor** (Duet. 25:17-19). On the Shabbat before Purim we read *Parshat Zachor*. All males have a biblical obligation to hear the Torah portion “*Zachor*” read in the synagogue. This portion recalls the unprovoked attack of the nation of Amalek upon the Jews in the desert. Haman was a descendent of Amalek. If one was not able to hear “*Zachor*” read on Shabbat, the obligation may be fulfilled by listening to the Torah reading of Purim day.
- 3) Saturday, April 2nd, *Parshat Shemini*, **Shabbat Para**, (Num. 19:1-22). The reading for *Parshat Para* describes the special waters derived from the Red Heifer used for the spiritual purification process in Temple days. This subject was important to remind Jews to maintain their spiritual purity or to purify themselves in order to be eligible to partake in the upcoming Passover offerings.
- 4) Saturday, April 9th, *Parshat Tazria*, **Shabbat Hachodesh** (Exodus 12:1-20). *Parshat Hachodesh* is read before *Rosh Chodesh Nissan*, which is the subject of that reading. It contains the first mitzvah given to the Jewish people while they were still in Egypt—the establishment of *Rosh Chodesh*. By declaring the new month, the Jewish people have the ability and responsibility to sanctify life and the passage of time.

#### Yahrzeit Observance In a Leap Year

This year, being a Jewish leap year, we add an extra month—*Adar II*.

A *Yahrzeit* is observed on the anniversary of the date of the death. *Yahrzeit* observance for a person who died during *Adar* of a regular year is observed in *Adar I* of the leap year. It is customary, however, to also observe the *Yahrzeit* in *Adar II*. Please note the distinction between *Adar* and *Adar I*.

For a person who, died in *Adar I/II* of a leap year, the observance during a regular year is on the same

date in the month of *Adar*.
